Expectations of an Elder or Deacon Candidate:

- 1. An officer candidate has a commitment to Jesus Christ and is willing to serve First Presbyterian Church in accordance with the theological standards of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) as defined in the *Book of Order* and the *Book of Confessions*.
- 2. An officer candidate:
 - a. must have joined First Presbyterian Church two (2) years prior to June 1, 2019.
 - b. is willing to undergo officer training under the direction of the pastor, whether or not the candidate has previously served as an officer.
 - c. is serious about corporate worship, participation in Christian Education, and development of one's spiritual life.
 - d. pledges to the church and considers the tithe as a standard.
 - e. makes a commitment to attend monthly meetings of the Board to which he/she is elected: Deacons, third Wednesday of each month; Session, fourth Wednesday of each month.
 - f. agrees to serve on at least one committee.
 - g. as a Deacon, is willing to shepherd members, to serve as an usher or to receive the offering, to lead by example in stewardship canvass, to minister compassionately.
 - h. as an Elder, is willing to shepherd members, to lead by example in stewardship canvass, to participate as an Elder representative in baptisms, to serve communion on Sunday in worship and on that afternoon to homebound members, to attend meetings of New Hope Presbytery on rotation with other Elders, to consider service on Presbytery-wide committees, to consider training as a liturgist for worship leadership.
